What's the NSF GRFP?

The NSF Graduate Research Fellowship Program (GRFP) provides fellowships to individuals selected early in their graduate careers based on their demonstrated potential for significant achievements in science, technology, and engineering. Three years of support (\$34,000 stipend, along with a \$12,000 cost of education allowance for tuition and feeds) is provided by the program for graduate study that is in a field within NSF's mission and that leads to a research-based master's or doctoral degree.

As the oldest graduate fellowship of its kind, the GRFP has a long history of selecting recipients who become knowledge experts in their future academic and professional careers. The reputation of the GRFP follows recipients and often helps them become life-long leaders who contribute significantly to both scientific innovation and teaching.

Am I eligible to apply?

- Applicants must be United States citizens, nationals, or permanent residents.
- Graduating seniors who are applying to graduate programs, and first-year or second-year graduate students are eligible.

What fields of study does NSF support?

- Chemistry; Computer and Information Science; Engineering; Geosciences; Life Sciences; Materials Research; Mathematical Sciences; Physics and Astronomy; Psychology; Social Sciences; STEM Education and Learning.
 - Social Sciences includes: Anthropology, Communications, Economics, Geography, History and Philosophy of Science, International Relations, Linguistics, Political Science, Public Policy, and Sociology.

- Not eligible are practice-oriented or clinical degree programs (MD, JD, MBA, MPH, MSW, etc.).

Deadlines for these fellowships are Oct. 22 – Oct 26, varying by field of study
